Dear friend, have a blast.

We built Tentr for you. For this moment. Right now. You can think of this land as your land for the duration of your stay. Respect the land and tent as you would your own. Squish your toes in the grass. Build a campfire and roast marshmallows. Leave it better than you found it. Go for a walk in the woods. Take a deep breath. Relax and recharge.

Canvas Wall Tent

These tents are custom-made for us in Denver, Colorado. They're awesome. They'll keep you dry as a bone. Don't lean bags or anything that you don't want to get wet against the canvas. Your tent has a screen door. Keep the screen door zipped shut. Bugs are pesky. **No smoking inside the tent and make sure nothing that's on fire gets close to the canvas.** If you're on fire, stop, drop and roll! If you notice any loose stakes, be a pal and hammer them in with a rock or something hard and heavy. Not your bare foot. Ouch.

Big Dome Tent

Included in your campsite is another tent for extra accommodations! If you need it, follow the instructions printed inside the carrying case. All you need to do is unfold and straighten the built-in poles and telescope them out until the metal buttons click into place. You're done (well...stake it down too, because, wind).

Before each use, line the bucket with a blue CleanWaste bag.

Tentrr Loo

This baby is elegant in its simplicity. Don't worry. Way less ick factor than you're thinking. The bags were designed by NASA for the space program. They have a secret powder inside that gels around waste and immediately blocks odors. When you're done, tie off the bag and throw it in your trash barrel. Landfill safe. Cool, right?

Sleeping Arrangements

- **Your Bunk Bed:** A great way to have a classic camping experience at your Tentrr campsite. Be sure to follow all instructions provided to get that bed bunked (or unbunked)!
- **Your Camp Cot:** Sometimes your bed might need a little more air. Use the red battery powered pump and unzip the liner at the foot of the bed to find the air valve. Pull the valve out, turn on the pump and blow up your bed!

Water Carrier

Water is key. For rinsing dishes, washing hands, Scotch and water, bird baths, etc. If your water container is empty (it's stored inside your CampBox bench) take it to the designated spot to fill it up. If you don't know where the spot is, ask your CampKeeper.

Sun Shower

Your solar sun shower should be filled up with potable water, left in the sunshine to warm up and then hung from a tree when you want to scrub up.

Never burn softwood (pine, fir or spruce) in the stove.

Never leave young ones unattended near the stove.

Wood Stove

Safety first. **Do not build a large fire in the stove.** It will damage the stove and get tropically hot in your tent. Small and steady will do the trick. Please use wood provided by the CampKeeper or kiln dried/bought at the store. Do not touch the stove while it's hot. You'll burn yourself. If smoke comes out of the stove and into the tent, open the doors and windows and then turn the pin sticking out of the stove pipe one-quarter turn. The pin controls a flap inside the pipe that acts as a flue.

Do not leave a fire burning when you are away from camp.

Building a Campfire

Newspaper. Kindling. Wood. That's what gets the party started. Tightly scrunch fifteen newspaper balls and toss them into the center of your fire pit. Arrange a bunch of dry twigs in a square pattern on top of the newspaper. Teepee four logs around the newspaper/kindling. Light the newspaper in several places and blow (a lot) at the base of the fire. (Store-bought fire starters is not cheating)

The minimum cleaning fee is \$50 and will be charged for leaving a campsite a mess.

Clean up, for fox sake

What you carry in, you must carry out!

- Check campsite for trash or belongings
- Carefully pack up the dome tent (if you used it)
- Clean out Tentrr CampBox (take your BBQ sauce!)
- Place (empty) Tentrr Loo inside canvas tent
- Zip up all tent windows and doors (clasps, too)
- Take garbage bag(s) to designated trash point (check with your CampKeeper)
- Clean up after your dog
- Clean grill with brush after use

Respect & Safety

- Respect your CampKeeper's site specific rules
- Don't carve your name into anything
- Don't cut down trees
- Look out for poison ivy, poison oak, and sumac
- **Check yourself for ticks every 6 hours**

Be Bear Aware

Food and odors can attract bears. Store food safely and keep campsite clean.

- Don't bring food into your tent
- Don't sleep in clothes you wore while cooking or handling fish or meat
- Keep all food inside a closed vehicle

Black bears are not aggressive, but they are around. Don't bother them and they won't bother you.
